## GARNER'S FIELD ALL WEATHER SHELTER

## - SHOOTING RULES -

- 1, This range can only be used using your own non 'FAC' (Fire Arms Certificated) 0.177 (4.5mm) air rifles (max 12ft/lbs) or air pistols max (6ft/lbs) or Nerf guns. This range is <u>not</u> suitable for Airsoft, BB guns or any other type of firearm please ensure they are not used.
- 2, The range must be run by a qualified range officer holding a current National Small Bore Rifle Association YPS (Youth Proficiency Scheme) Air Rifle Instructor Certificate or other recognised qualification. Evidence of certification will need to be submitted when making a booking.
- 3, There are only four fixed firing target areas available on the range. These can be shot at either standing, bench rest or prone. Each target must be used with a pellet catcher available on site.
- 4, Please hang your target pellet catcher on the marked screws. Please do not move the screws as these are set at the correct height for 6 yard standing, benchrest and prone firing positions. The marked line on the floor marks the 6 yard point from the target.
- 5, If you wish to shoot chalks, corks, rotating targets etc. then you must hang a ballistic curtain in front of the back wall using the anchoring points provided and then erect free standing target holders. You must not use the shelter's tables/chairs as target supports. You will need to adjust the position of the firing points accordingly.
- 6, Due to the risk of lead contamination it is imperative that the varnished floor is dampened down BEFORE SWEEPING with the supplied and marked up soft broom or dustpan please use the supplied backpack water sprayer, there is no need to soak the floor, just a light spray to limit any dust.
- 7, Please supply your own dampened cleaning cloths to wipe down all the table surfaces at the end of every session.

- 8, Please empty the used lead from the pellet catchers into the lead recycling tin provided. Floor sweepings if heavily contaminated with dust, leaves, mud etc. should go in the bin otherwise they can be emptied into the lead recycling tin.
- 9, A logbook is supplied this is to be fully filled in for EVERY shooting session by the range officer in charge
- 10, Pellet catchers, shooting rests, the logbook and the lead recycling tin are all in the locked cupboard in the shelter. Access details will be provided when booking. Please return all items once shooting is finished and report any damage.
- 11, The marked broom, dustpan and water sprayer are to be returned to their marked pegs on the wall to ensure they remain accessible to all, THESE ARE NOT TO BE REMOVED FROM THE SHELTER AT ANY TIME!
- 12, Safety glasses should be used by all persons when the range is live.
- 13, Please advise all participants that the disabled toilet is always open for hand washing on completion of a shooting session.
- 14, Failure to follow these rules will result in shooting privileges at Garners Field being withdrawn immediately by the duty warden.
- 15, At the end of all sessions the temporary plastic barriers MUST be put back in place approximately 1m from the carpeted wall.
